4.0 EXAMINATION

Nature of Examination & Standard of Passing

A) Theory Examination:

1. There shall be 50 marks for each theory course (paper). For each course 40:10 pattern shall be applicable, wherein 40 marks shall be for Universityassessment (UA) and 10 marks for Internal assessment (IA).

2. There shall be separate passing for theory as well as internal examinations. Minimum 14 marks out of 40 required for passing University assessment (UA) and minimum 4 marks out of 10 required for passing Internal assessment (IA).

B) Continuous Internal Examination (C.I.E.):

ContinuousInternal Examination will be compulsory for all students. If a student fails/remains absent in the internal examination then she will have to clear it in subsequent attempt/s.TheContinuousInternal Examination of 10 Marks shall be carried out at the end of completion of each unit in the course. The nature of questions shall be MCQ / true/false / one sentence answer type question / short answer type question.

C) Pratical Examination:

1. The Practical examination shall be conducted annually. There shall be 100 marks for each laboratory course .A minimum of 35 % marksare required for passing.

2. There shall be a separate head of passing for Practical Examination.

10.0 GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Candidate should carefully read the prospectus issued by the College, Instructions as well as the relevant University publications. The rules contained in the course as well as those made by the College and changes made therein, from time to time, shall be binding on the candidate and her guardians.
- Candidates are admitted to the programme, subject to the rules of Shivaji University, Kolhapur as to the eligibility, grant of terms etc.
